In the month of Earth Hour we urge you to sign the Earth Hour petition to stop Eskom from putting the brakes on renewable energy.

Why this is important now

The bulk of South Africa's carbon emissions come from coal-based electricity. Like most countries, we need to address this by bringing more renewable energy (such as solar and wind energy) into our electricity mix. Not only does renewable energy reduce carbon emissions, but it can be scaled up and deployed quickly to match the country's need for more energy.

Despite this, Eskom is preventing South Africa from realising multiple benefits from our globally lauded Renewable Energy Independent Power Producer Procurement Programme (REIPPPP) by not signing the remaining contracts to buy power from the renewable energy sector. This is putting the entire renewable energy programme at risk.

Rising electricity prices are a depressing reality for all of us – as individuals, organisations and businesses. Many households cannot even afford electricity to maintain a basic standard of living for their families. Renewable energy can help to address this issue.

What about the night of Earth Hour?

For the past decade WWF has encouraged participation in the global switching off of lights during Earth Hour which takes place on the last Saturday in March from 8.30pm to 9.30pm local time in countries around the world. This year Earth Hour is on Saturday 25 March 2017.

By switching off your lights you will be participating in a symbolic gesture of unity to reflect on our impact on the planet. As a global citizen movement of positive change for the environment, Earth Hour is about collective action towards combatting climate change – and going beyond the hour through our daily choices and actions.
